The National Master IPC TOT training for COVID-19objectives were;

- o To increase the knowledge and skills among health workers on infection prevention and control practices in the advent of Corona Virus
- To train healthcare workers on how to limit human to human transmission including reducing secondary infections among healthcare workers, other patients and close contacts
- To equip healthcare workers on early identification, health education on selfquarantine, contact tracing for COVID-19 and isolation as well as caring for patients, including providing support to families and risk communication in Covid 19 response
- o Donning and Doffing procedures recommended for COVID 19

Topics covered during the training include

- o Introduction and background of Covid 19, Origin and dynamic global situation, trend and projections, signs and symptoms and management approach
- Surveillance procedures for primary screening, risk assessment, referral of suspected cases
- o Case management of COVID 19
- o Screening and contact tracing and referral and tools for use
- o Infection prevention (IPC) and correct Personal protective gear (PPE) for COVID 19
- o Cleaning and disinfection of linen, clothing, utensils and surfaces for COVID 19
 - o Injection safety and healthcare waste management for COVID
- o Laboratory sample collections, diagnosis and follow up for Covid 19 patients
- o Practical sessions of two samples collection
- o Rights roles and responsivities of health workers, stakeholders
- o Occupational safety measures for Covid 19
- o Facility and health systems preparedness and constituting COVID 19 rapid response teams
- Risk communication for COVID 19

Next steps

- o After the two days training, the TOTs were released to prepare and when called upon they will go train health workers in 33 priority counties and other facilities that require
- o Continue to advocate for holistic approach to combating the COVID 19 global pandemic
- From 23-25th March, we trained 30 KDF health professionals from all units across the country who have taken up to sensitize health workers from their units on COVID 19 Preparedness.
- o COVID 19 role plays are good practical sessions to pass information to health workers easily and needs to be adopted going forward

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
