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FOREWORD

Dear Attendees,

The International Women's Day celebrates the achievements of women in various spheres: social, political, economic, and cultural. In line with this year's theme, '**Inspire Inclusion**,' Strathmore University Business School (SBS), in partnership with the Kenya Health Federation (KHF), is convening a conference under the theme, "**Inspiring Gender Inclusion: Empowering Leaders, Bridging Gaps.**" This event aims to bring together women leaders, male allies, and influential figures in the healthcare profession and other sectors. The chosen theme aligns seamlessly with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 5 (**Gender Equality**). The conference addresses the gender data gaps identified in the UN SDG Goals report for 2023, emphasizing the need to empower women and bridge existing leadership gaps.

Building on the progress reported, SBS actively contributes to achieving the SDGs, especially SDG 8 (**Decent Work and Economic Growth**), through the **Women in Health Leadership project**. This initiative, sponsored by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation in collaboration with the Kenya Healthcare Federation, collected crucial research on the status of women across various health sectors, directly addressing the data highlighted in the UN report.

The gathered research findings provide optimism as we continue raising awareness about the benefits of gender diversity and inclusion in organizations. However, challenges persist in the representation of women in middle and senior management levels. Research indicates a phenomenon known as the **"Leaking Pipeline Syndrome,"** where female talent is lost from entry-level through senior management. Notably, Progress on increasing women's representation in management has been slow, with only a 1.0-percentagepoint increase since 2015. This is according to the SDG Progress Report 2023. Addressing this issue remains a priority as we strive for greater gender equality in leadership positions.

SBS and KHF has curated a distinguished group of speakers from diverse backgrounds who will delve deeper into this year's theme. They will share their career journeys, successes, and challenges. Join SBS and KHF as we celebrate this year's **International Women's Day** and reflect on this year's theme centred on **"Inspiring Gender Inclusion: Empowering Leaders, Bridging Gaps."** The International Women's Day provides an opportunity to reflect and celebrate the holistic contribution of women at a global scale.


